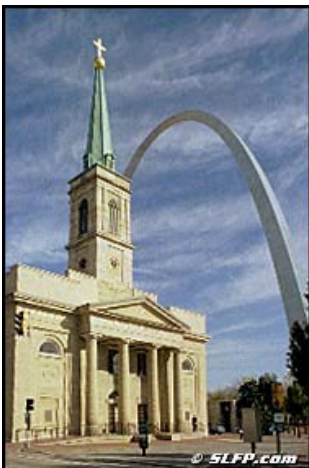

Dress Casual. Average July temperature is 88°F. Scheduled free time will be Friday morning and Saturday morning because of the potential heat. The evenings will be comfortable.

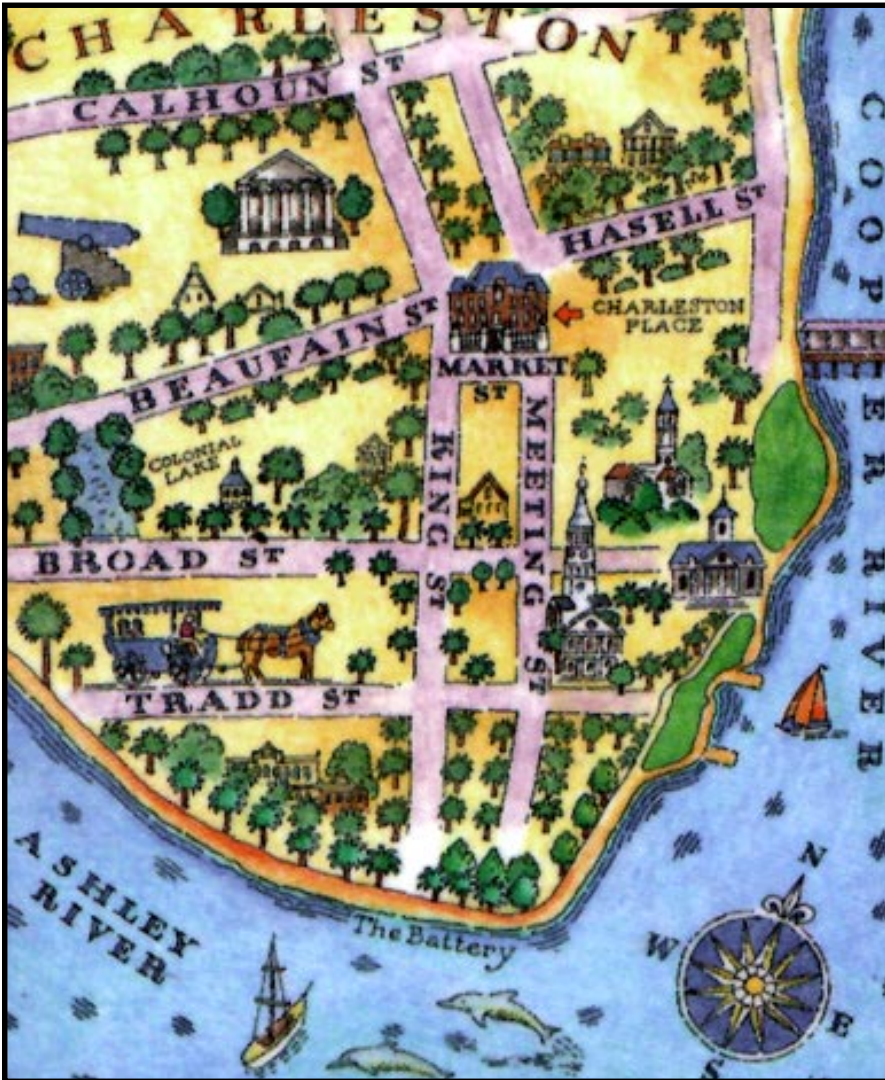

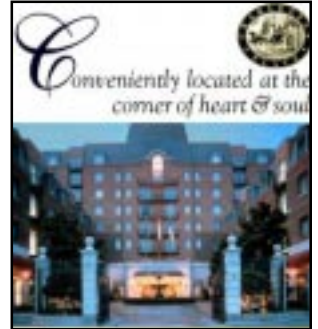

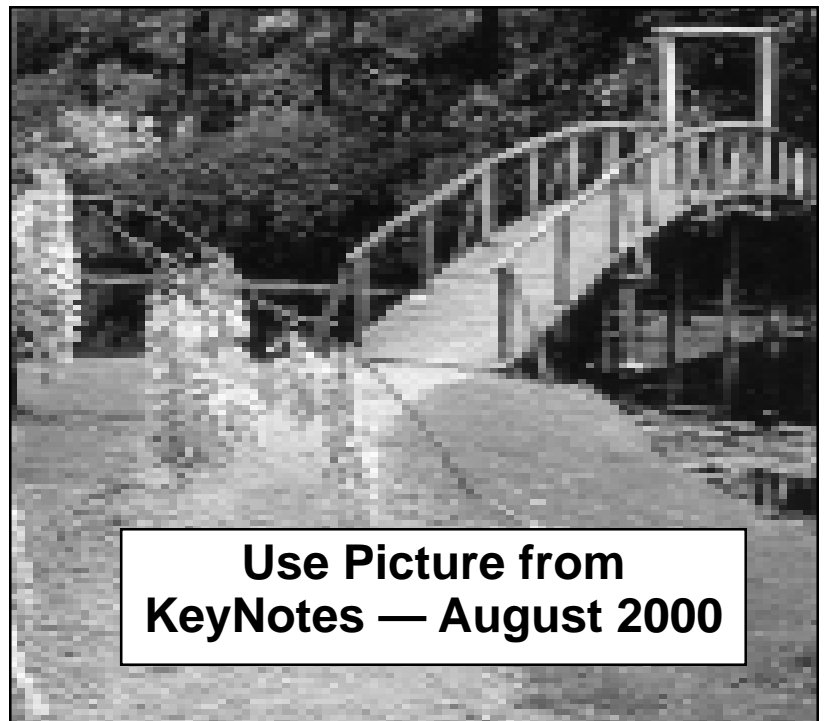
CEC XIX – Charleston, South Carolina July 26 – 29, 2001
